WHY ARE THESE IMPORTANT PLACES?

THE OPERA: It is one of the world's most visited opera and ballet theatres and has been chosen as the setting and setting for numerous literary, theatrical, and film pieces.

THE EIFFEL TOWER: It is important because it was constructed to commemorate the centennial of the French Revolution.

THE SACRE COEUR: it is an important church from Paris in homage to the memory of the many French citizens who lost their lives during the Franco-Prussian war.

NOTRE DAME: It is a very important cathedral from Paris, dedicated to the Virgin Mary.

THE PHANTEON: Initially planned in the 18th century to be a church that would house the reliquary of Saint Genova, this monument is intended to honor the great figures who have marked the history of France.

ARC THE TRIOMPHE: it's one of the most important monument from Paris. Built between 1806 and 1836 by order of Napoleon Bonaparte to commemorate the victory at the Battle of Austerlitz.

LES IMVALIDES: it's an architectural complex located in the seventh district of Paris. Originally created as a royal residence for retired French soldiers and servicemen, it is especially known for housing the mortal remains of Emperor Napoleon.

MUSÉE DE CLUNY: It is important because it has thousands of works from between the 3rd and 16th centuries, including a magnificent exhibition of tapestries, sculptures, stained glass, goldsmiths, jeweler and ivories.

PLACE RÉPUBLIQUE: It is a Parisian square that is located on the limits of Districts III, X and XI. Given its symbolism, it is usually used by left-wing parties and unions as a place of demonstration.

CEMETERY PÈRE LACHAISE: It is the largest intramural cemetery in Paris, and one of the most famous in the world. It has the peculiarity that many Parisians use it as if it were a park. At the beginning of the 19th century, several cemeteries were built in order to replace the old cemeteries of Paris.
